## Year 7 Literacy and Numeracy catch up premium

## Rationale for spending

Our spending was decided based on the following:

- Primary transition meetings and discussions with primary head teachers and staff to secure progress from Key Stage 2 & 3
- Primary transition progress data and student profiles
- 'The Sutton Trust' research evidence
- Best practice from other trust schools

St Martins School received approx. £6,600 in catch up funding in 2017-18 and we expect the funding to be a similar amount in 2018-19

## How do we spend the money?

- Staffing for reading programme interventions in tutor time, years 7
- Literacy online assessment tool and the accelerated reader programme
- IT packages, units of sound etc.
- Laptops for students to access lessons and use for intervention
- Catch up Numeracy small group and one to one sessions
- Catch Up Literacy small group and one to one sessions
- Additional books and resources to support literacy and numeracy

## **Strategies**

- Use new KS2 data to identify students below 100 for reading or maths. Internal assessment is used to assess our students from Welsh
- Students 'below the floor' of 96 will be placed into appropriate bottom band sets.
  Exceptions to be made for students with high score in one area but low in another here the students will be placed in a set according to their best score and in the other subject school will provide targeted intervention to bring the student 'up-to-speed'.
- TAs working with literacy & numeracy will continue to complete termly impact reports which will be reviewed by our SENCO and English and Maths teams
- English and Maths intervention managers will co ordinate their interventions alongside the specific year 7 catch up interventions
- Year 8 students who have not made appropriate progress in Y7 will be identified and strategies put in place.
- Targeted numeracy and Literacy interventions to be reviewed by HOD and core teams appropriate actions taken.
