<p>PE You will be focusing on different skills within</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Athletics - Softball - Rounders - Cricket 		<p>Humanities History - You will be learning history of slavery with specific reference to the Transatlantic Slave Trade/ Then you'll be moving onto what life was like during the Industrial Revolution with specific reference to Whitechapel in 1888 and the Ripper murders. Geography - You will be focusing on the continent of Asia with references to coasts and resource management. RS - Experiencing God, key beliefs and teachings. PSE - A focus on careers; what careers are available to you and what skills do you need? Healthy lifestyles and First Aid.</p>
<p>Performing Arts Music - This term you will be exploring the unit of theme and variation where you will learn about augmentation, diminution, canon/round and counter melodies as variation techniques as well as retrograde, inversion and retrograde Inversion as variation techniques. In the second half of the term you will be developing your guitar skills and learning basic chords. Drama - Superheroes. You will be creating own character, builds on skills from the Island project and Melodrama but now you will provide a background to your character, think about your alter-ego and their superhero- differentiate. You will revisit exaggeration, use montage and narration; thought tracking will be revisited but use this to convey a message alongside juxtaposition. You will also learn how we assume and make judgements about people without fully knowing their background. You will create your own super hero drama which will include stage fighting.</p>	<p>Languages Spanish - You will be learning how to describe a holiday home and activities whilst there, summer camps and holiday destinations. You will develop your skills in asking for direction. You will spend the rest of the term revisiting and mastering the modules you have completed during the year. French - You will be learning how talk about a town or village, be able to say where you are going out at the weekend. You will learn how to invite someone out, how to order drinks and snacks with particular reference to breakfast. There will be links to Paris and their cafes. In the second half of the term you will be developing your skills in be able to discuss what you are going to do and be able to talk about your plans in more detail. Using Paris as a springboard you will bring all of these skills together to pretend you have visited the city and you will learn the appropriate tenses and verbs to be able to say what you have visited in Paris and what you have liked doing and why.
