#### Years 1 & 2

Primary Education is an extremely important stage in a child's development. We aim to give children a happy and confident start at school. Children develop quickly in the early years and a child's experiences between birth and age five have a major impact on their future life chances.

Good parenting and high quality early learning together provide the foundation children need to make the most of their abilities and talents as they grow.

Throughout the Nursery and Reception, children experience an exciting curriculum, both indoors and outdoors, designed to meet the needs of young children. This is fun, creative and play based and challenges each child to achieve his/her individual potential.

As well as giving them the essential tools for learning we are committed to enabling children to grow and develop in all areas of life so that they discover more about themselves and learn to value their achievements. The team at St Martins School provide a positive rewarding ethos. We encourage an awareness and respect for others.

In years 1 and 2 we build on the foundations from reception developing skills in literacy, numeracy and phonics.





#### Key Stage 2

In years 3 and 4 students develop skills and depth of understanding in numeracy and literacy.

Cross-curricular links are made wherever possible and relevant, allowing the children to use their knowledge and skills across the whole curriculum and to make connections between different subjects.


Being creative and flexible at the planning stage allows us to encourage creativity in the children and the

At KS4 we strive to offer the most exciting and diverse options to all. We constantly review KS4 curriculum to ensure it offers the maximum opportunities for all our students.


GCSE studies are enhanced by our collaboration with Moreton Hall, Walford and North Shropshire College.




## Aspirations
