

## Tops tips for helping your child in languages.

- 1. Test your child frequently on the language they have learnt that week. In years 7, 8 and 9 all students are expected to practise and learn the key 70 words. These 70 words will be tested weekly. Students can go on line to practise these words.

- Remind your child to log on weekly to the website

   to see if any online homework has been set.
- 3. **Encourage your child to teach you** what they have learnt in French or Spanish.
- 4. **Download language applications** from a smart phone to play back and listen to frequently.
- 5. To help with homework encourage your child to use their exercise books and work booklets (especially the vocabulary pages) and revision guides to check prior learning and to build upon skills developed in the lesson.
- 6. Use the suggested language websites for help.
- 7. Encourage your child to revise, review and **practice the language regularly**. **Little and often** is much more effective than trying to learn huge amounts in one go. Also encourage your child to use any strategy that will improve or aid their memory skills (visual aids, post it notes etc).
