
Introduction to Modern Foreign Languages





At St Martins School the Modern Foreign Language Department offers two languages: **Spanish** and **French.**

Primary department

French is studied in the **Primary department** from Years 4 to Year 6 with two half hour lessons per week. In primary the focus is on enjoyment, oral communication and pupil participation through a variety of activities such as games and songs.

Secondary department

Both **Spanish** and **French** is offered in secondary.

Year 7

All Year 7 students study 4 hours of languages per week; two hours of French and two hours of Spanish. In the summer term of Year 7 students are required to choose to continue with either Spanish or French. This will be the language that students continue with up to GCSE (years 8- 10). The decision as to which language to continue with is made alongside discussions with the student's language teacher.

Year 8

Students study either Spanish or French. In year 8 languages are taught over two hours per week. Details about the curriculum can be found on the website.

Year 9 and 10

The Modern Foreign Languages Department offers GCSE courses in both **Spanish** and **French**. From September 2017 all students studying a modern foreign language start the two year GCSE language course in year 9 and then go on to sit the GCSE exams in year 10. This arrangement enables students to have more curriculum time - in year 9 languages are taught over three hours a week and in year 10 over four hours per week.
