

## Year 10: What are we doing about mock exams?

Departments have made their own decisions about the best way to gather evidence towards your final grade. Below are details from each department.

Subject	How will mocks be carried out?	Specific date/time
Science	Full set of mocks to be sent home. Completed in own time – honest comment on how you completed the papers.	Chemistry & Physics paper 1 – back in school by 29 January  Chemistry & Physics paper 2 back by 5 February
<p>MFL – schedule Mon 18<sup>th</sup> period 2 exam revision –taught lesson.</p> <p>Tues 19<sup>th</sup> period 5 (tutorial session) or time of students choosing on that day. <b>Reading Paper</b></p> <p>Wed 20<sup>th</sup> period 2 (tutorial session) ( 10.25) <b>Listening paper</b> Students must accept the call and then listen to the audio files through the screen. A copy of the audio files will be uploaded shortly after in case of technical problems and students can listen through headphones at home</p> <p>Fri 22 period 2 ( taught lesson) <b>Writing paper.</b> After a short introduction about the paper and checking of comprehension students can complete the paper in real time or later that day.</p> <p>Students can choose to use reference material such as 100 word sheet and vocab booklet only and must record what they have used on the front of the paper.</p> <p>Eg –I have completed this paper from memory <b>or</b> I have completed this paper using my vocab book and /or 100 words sheet.</p>	<p>To be completed at home during lesson time and following this schedule</p> <p>Please sign the front of each paper stating how the test was completed. Eg I completed this test in exam conditions <b>or</b></p> <p>I completed this test over a period of time using my vocab book and exercise books to help.</p> <p>Students may ask parents to sign to authenticate also</p>	Deadline 29 January for papers back to school
