NHS Test and Trace: COVID-19 testing for secondary students

Dear Parent or guardian,

We are working to keep our school as safe as possible. You may have heard that testing for those without coronavirus symptoms is beginning across the country using new, quicker COVID-19 tests known as 'lateral flow tests'.

Along with the other protective measures we are taking, these tests will help staff and students to remain in school safely. Up to one third of people who have coronavirus experience no symptoms. By testing we will help to stop the virus spread and help to keep our school open as safely as possible. The test is voluntary, but I would encourage everyone to take it.

We have already started testing staff and secondary school students (critical workers) who have been in school. We understand when students in secondary return to school that this testing will be offered.

An instructional leaflet with some more information is on the school website.

If you are happy for your child to be tested, please fill in the form below and the enclosed consent statement (one per pupil/student) and return it to the St Martins School office [via email/in person].

Those taking the test will be supervised by trained school staff so your child will be supported by familiar people. The 'lateral flow' tests are quick and easy using a swab of your nose and throat. For under 18s, staff can oversee the swab process.

Results (which take around half an hour from testing) will be shared directly with pupils participating. Where participants are under 16, parents or legal guardians will also be informed.

The government have informed us that they know these tests work - in validation studies conducted by Oxford University and Public Health England, they were shown to be as accurate in identifying a case as a PCR test (99.68% specificity). The tests have lower sensitivity but they are better at picking up cases when a person has higher viral load, hence the need to test frequently.

Testing will be offered free of charge.

What if a pupil tests positive?

Participating pupils who test positive will be informed about their results individually. Where participants are under 16, parents or legal guardians will also be notified. Guidance on safe travel and additional precautions will be provided along with test results. They will then be isolated and will need to go home to continue to isolate and follow the guidance from NHS Track and Trace.

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What happens if the test is negative?

They will be able to stay in school and resume their activities as normal. A pupil will only be told if they test positive on a 'lateral flow' test, so if you do not hear you can assume it was negative. A small number of pupils may need to repeat the test if the first test was invalid or void for some reason.

What if my child develops symptoms?

This testing programme at St Martins School is for people with no symptoms. If your child develops symptoms at any time (such as a high temperature; a new, continuous cough; or a loss or change to their sense of smell or taste) they must immediately self-isolate, and book a test by calling 119 (England, Wales and Northern Ireland) visiting <https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test>.

We will support our pupils throughout, but please contact us if you need any further information.
