Covid19

Thank you to all parents for your patience and understanding with the Covid19 procedures. I have to thank my Admin team, who have been amazing in their organisation and support for parents.

Please continue to keep your child at home if they are displaying Covid19 symptoms and secondary students should continue to flow test twice weekly.

If your child has symptoms or a positive, flow test please keep them at home and get a PCR test done.

If your child is a close contact with a positive case, please do a daily flow test before sending them to school for 10 days and if they develop symptoms get a PCR test

If someone in the household has a positive PCR then students should be taken for a PCR test before they can return to school and it is now recommended by Shropshire Health that they have a second PCR test on day 5.
