Here are some of our Primary student school Councillors planting the crocus bulbs that we were gifted by Oswestry Rotary Club to raise awareness of polio.





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

Private Peaceful by Michael Morpurgo - This is a student pick, specifically for Remembrance Day. Michael Morpurgo is a fantastic writer for pupils to get into, as he is so versatile, and he has written books for a wide variety of age groups.
