Day at St Martins School

Induction/Transition day 26 JUNE 2024

Our Year 6 induction day will take place on WEDNESDAY 26 JUNE.

If students could come to school in their usual school uniform, and bring a pencil case/bag.

They will also need to bring a packed lunch (including a drink) and morning snack.



Rewards & House Activities

At St Martins School students are actively encouraged to demonstrate excellence in everything they do through the Reward Programme.

Student reports are used to identify those students who are invited to take part; celebrating those students who are achieving their targets and who demonstrate a positive attitude to their learning.

Transport to school

Transport to school for secondary students is available from the local authority if you live more than three miles from school and St Martins School is your nearest school.

You need to apply as soon as possible and before May to guarantee your place.

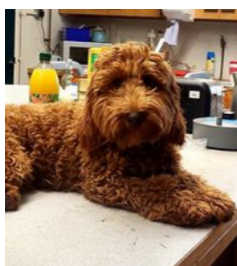

Uniform

A school uniform plays a valuable role in contributing to the ethos of a school and setting an appropriate tone.

We feel having a uniform helps to

- instil pride;
- support positive behaviour and discipline;
- encourage identity with, and support for, school ethos;
- ensure pupils of all backgrounds feel welcome;
- protect children from social pressures to dress in a particular way;
- and nurture cohesion and promote good relations between different groups of pupils.

Above all, we believe that school uniform supports effective teaching and learning. We regularly hold pre loved uniform sales and have a number of embroidered badges that parents can buy.

In terms of general appearance, we require students to “look smart and work smart”.

- Hair should be of a natural monochrome colour and the style must be appropriate for school. Hair should be no shorter than a ‘grade 2’ without tramlines.
- Facial piercings are not appropriate for school; minimal jewellery (watch and one ring) can be worn but must be removed for certain activities.
- Make up if worn should be natural. Fake nails and eyelashes are not permitted. They prevent the full participation in practical lessons and are a health and safety hazard.

For year 7 the items of uniform are as follows:

- White buttoned up to the neck school shirt with collar (available from any clothing supplier and many supermarkets at very reasonable prices)
- The school’s purple and HOUSE TIE which must be worn so that it covers the top button of the shirt
- The school’s purple v neck sweat shirt with the school logo

No other jumpers will be allowed in school.

In addition, students will have the choice of the following items:

- Grey trousers (leggings, canvas jeans style or skinny trousers are not permitted) **OR**
- A purple and grey checked skirt from our uniform provider.
- Tailored knee length shorts can be worn for the summer term. These must be knee length and not cargo or jean style. Grey for years up to and including year 8, black for years 9-11. They will be worn with black school shoes.

All students will be required to wear black leather type shoes with black laces whenever they are in the school buildings—trainers and canvas shoes are not permitted.

School coats should be a dark colour without visible branding.

Examples of suitable footwear, skirts and trousers are available on the [school website](#) Students not wearing the correct uniform may spend the day in isolation, detention or be required to wear uniform provided by school.

PE kit

Core part of the PE kit is a black and purple polo sports top with the school badge, which must be worn with either the school shorts or skort. **PLAIN BLACK UNBRANDED PE TOP/SHORTS/SKORTS CAN BE WORN AS AN ALTERNATIVE**
PLAIN BLACK BASE LAYER BOTTOMS CAN BE WORN UNDER SKORT/SHORTS IF THE WEATHER IS COLD

A ‘gum shield’ is highly recommended. From year 7, boys and girls will require football boots.

Following feedback from parents we have introduced an online ordering system via our suppliers, RAM leisure in Wrexham. This means parents can order direct for delivery to home and can order at times convenient to them rather than waiting for the school to bulk order. <http://www.ourschoolwear.co.uk/>

Quinta Camp 2024

Quinta residential St Martins School 10th and 11th JULY 2024

We are pleased to be able to offer the opportunity for students to attend our residential at the Quinta Christian Centre at Weston Rhyn as part of our Induction Programme for students joining us in September 2024.

The main purpose of this venture is to make sure all students feel confident and happy about joining year 7 at St Martins School and to meet some of their new teachers and all of their new friends. They will have two very busy days, one entertaining evening and one (usually exciting!) night together, completing a variety of tasks which encourage cooperation, team building and new friendships, as well as learning about how school is organised and some of the rules and expectations we have.

A variety of staff from St Martins School will accompany the students and provide many of the activities. Also working with us will be Thirzla Deakin, the Education Officer at Quinta, who works with us regularly.

St Martins School will continue to subsidise the cost for those students joining our Year 7 in September 2024. We are asking for a payment of £35 this year to cover some of the expenses for the two days.

This will pay for

- all activities
- use of all the Quinta facilities
- overnight stay in Quinta hall –

students will be accommodated this year in the halls bedrooms which sleep 2,3 or 4 students and are of a hotel standard.

- transport of equipment and students' belongings to Quinta
- cooked evening meal on Wednesday evening, breakfast and packed lunch on Thursday

Students will need to provide their own packed lunch and drinks for Wednesday.

(Any student on free school meals who wishes to have lunch provided should contact their school).

In cases of genuine difficulty in paying for the residential, we are very happy to help, and can offer days only for a charge of £20 or set up instalments prior to the camp. Please contact me at school if you will find it difficult to pay.

Places for overnight stay are limited and will be allocated on a first come first served basis, after which day places will be offered.

Bookings will not be accepted after the 28 JUNE.

USEFUL INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

The move to secondary school can be a daunting one. St Martins School works closely with local primary schools to ensure that the Transition runs as smoothly as possible. Our transition process really does start as early as possible.

Head of School, Ms Sue Lovecy is often 'out and about' at Primary schools so your child will probably already know her and she will know your child!

Schools have the opportunity to visit us on a number of our Primary days, giving students the opportunity to familiarise themselves with our staff, students and departments.

Over the course of the remainder of this academic year Ms Lovecy and tutors will be visiting pupils at our local primary schools in Gobowen, Selattyn and Weston Rhyn, Chirk and further afield.

EQUIPMENT AND VALUABLES

Every student is expected to provide the following basic items of equipment for every lesson:

- **A school bag large enough to carry several books is essential**

- Black or blue pen
- Pencil and eraser
- Coloured pencils
- Pencil sharpener
- Ruler
- Geometry Set
- Calculator
- Rough Notebook
- Dictionary
- French/Spanish Dictionary
- Personal headphones (for use in French/Music/ICT lessons)



Text books and specialised equipment will be issued on loan and parents may be required to contribute towards any loss or damage to school property.

It is students responsibility to remember their kit for Physical Education and Dance.

If these are forgotten for three lessons students will receive a detention.



Valuables

Any items of value are brought into school entirely at your own risk.

We operate a cashless diner and encourage students not to bring money into school.

- **Mobile Phones** and other electronic equipment, such as **iPods** and **MP3 players**, must not be used on the school site during school hours. If they are brought into school, they need to be switched off in and school bags. If not they will be confiscated until the end of the day. Smart watches must only be used for telling the time.

- Please make sure that any valuables are put into the valuables box during PE, drama and dance lessons.

- Energy drinks are not permitted in school

Fizzy/energy drinks

We are seeing a small number of students coming into school with carbonated sugary drinks or energy drinks. Energy drinks are not recommended for children. The NHS state that potential risks include:

- caffeine overdose (which can lead to a number of symptoms, including palpitations, high blood pressure, nausea and vomiting, convulsions and, in some cases, even death)
- type 2 diabetes - as high consumption of caffeine reduces insulin sensitivity
- neurological and cardiovascular system effects in children and adolescents
- Attention seeking behaviour
- use and dependence on other harmful substances
- poor dental health
- Obesity

Carbonated sugary drinks are also linked to some of the above health risks. **School has a no energy drink/carbonated sugary drink policy. Any drinks in breach of the policy will be confiscated.**

ATTENDANCE UPDATE

Attendance at school is a legal requirement, and as members of our school community, it is fair to have high expectations concerning attendance and to expect that everyone makes the effort to make sure their children attend school each day.

Poor attendance can seriously affect each child's:-

- attainment in school
- relationships with other children and their ability to form lasting friendships
- confidence to attempt new work and work alongside others

Parents/carers should ring in every day for which a child is absent from school, communicating the reason for this absence.

School attendance is always the responsibility of parents and carers, but here at St Martins, we want to make sure that all families have the support they need. In order that we can work together as a team it may be useful for you to have an awareness of the processes we go through in school to support high attendance.

Form tutors (Secondary) will meet with pupils to discuss any barriers to good attendance and seek to agree some strategies for improvements on an 'Attendance Action Plan', putting in place any support which may be identified. On a weekly basis we work with our Educational Welfare Officer (EWO) to discuss attendance registers, and any students whose attendance is falling below 95%; we will share the 'Attendance Action Plan' with our EWO.

Non-attendance is an important issue that is treated seriously. However each case is different and the school acknowledges that no one standard response will be appropriate in every case. Consideration is given to all factors affecting attendance before deciding what intervention strategies to apply. In every case, early intervention is essential to prevent the problem from worsening. It is essential that parents/carers keep the school fully informed of any matters that may affect their child's attendance.

We request that your children do not miss unnecessary days when they are not genuinely ill, for reasons such as tiredness or having a cold. If your child is genuinely poorly then do not send them in. If you are unsure, send them to school and we can make a judgement during the day.

We have seen an increase in term-time holidays post-pandemic, which is understandable considering the disruption of the past 2 years. This year, however, term-time holidays will not be authorised by school. Only 1 day of absence will be authorised for weddings or funerals.

Punctuality in addition to attendance is equally important. To clarify students are expected to arrive at school at the times below.
