Stunning Starter: Rations - creating a wartime rationed meal	Magnificent Middle: Holocaust Museum virtual talk	Fantastic Finish - Churchill Day - art and Literacy based around his speeches
English: Text: Star of Hope, Star of Fear by Jo Hoestlandt. Outcome: To write a story with a flashback from another character's point of view Write scenes with dialogue, description, diary entries, collect examples of cohesion, recounts, letters, plan and write a story. Guided Reading: When We Were Warriors by Emma Carroll Grammar: Cohesive devices (for example using different pronouns, conjunctions and time adverbials like 'before long'), colons, passive verbs, adverbials, expanded noun phrases, inverted commas, consistent and correct tenses, bullet points Spelling: Hyphenated words, ei after c, ough, silent letters, homophones, statutory words Handwriting: continue with writing fluency, letter formation and joins (Catch up: Editing, Grammar sessions, Spelling recap)	 Fractions - add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions, explore common denominators and use this to help order and compare fractions Converting units - metric, miles and kilometres, imperial measures (Catch up: 4 operations) 	Science In Science will be studying a unit on electricity. The children will learn to: • associate the brightness of a lamp or the volume of a buzzer with the number and voltage of cells used in the circuit • compare and give reasons for variations in how components function, including the brightness of bulbs, the loudness of buzzers and the on/off position of switches • use recognised symbols when representing a simple circuit in a diagram
