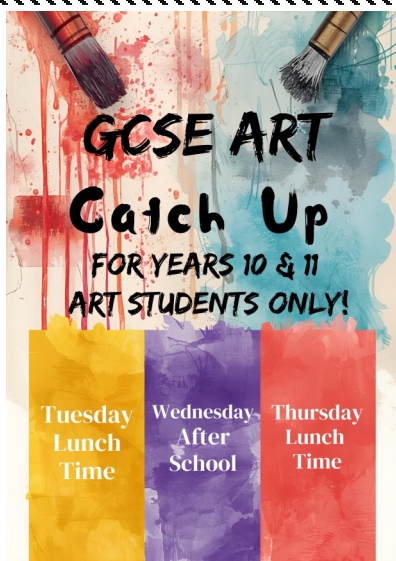
## PRIMARY Monthly Art Competition

Symmetrical, fragile flakes of snow

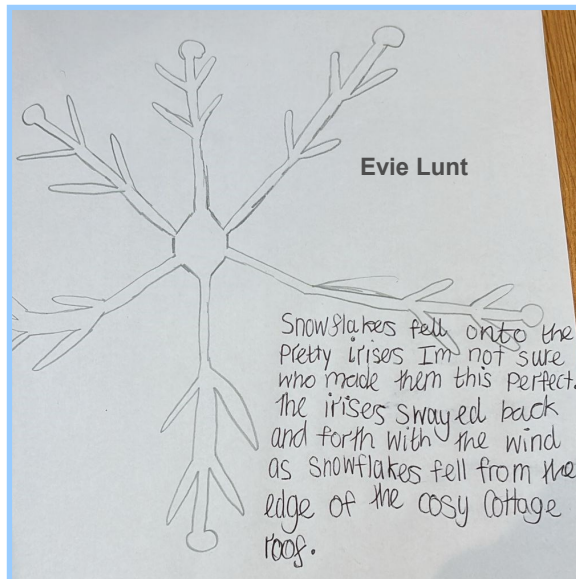
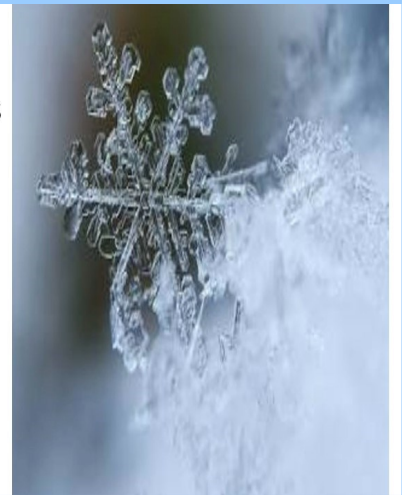
The snowy silence is all I know.
