Fantastic Finish. Design and make torches

English (incl. SPAG, HW, class books)
 Class text: Escape from Pompeii.
 Yr 4: Use conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to express time, place and cause. Create characters, settings and plot in narrative. Group related ideas into paragraphs. Write a sequence of events to follow the structure of a historical story. Write historical recounts and narratives based on the events in 'When the Giant stirred'. Add historical detail to characters, setting and events.
 Yr 3: Form nouns with a range of prefixes
 Use present and past tenses correctly and consistently including the progressive form and the present perfect form. Use inverted commas to punctuate direct speech (and to show relationship between two characters)
Spelling: Suffixes - 'ness' and 'ful', Prefixes - 'sub' and 'tele-'
 Apostrophes for contraction.

Mathematics Year 4 Number - multiplication and division. Multiply two-digit and three-digit numbers by a one-digit number using formal written layout. Problem solving - multiplication. Multiplying more than two numbers. Problem solving - mixed correspondence problems. Dividing a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number. Measurement. What is area? Counting squares. Making shapes. Comparing area. Number - fractions (including decimals).
Yr 3: . Multiply two-digit numbers by a one-digit number. Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables. Use place value, known and derived facts to multiply and divide mentally.

Science -
 Children will learn about electricity and how it is created, what it is used for and how to stay safe whilst using it. The children will complete an experiment using scientific equipment and they will draw on their cross-curricular link in Design and Technology whilst making the torches.

Knowledge & Understanding of the World including British Values and What's in the news & Where is in World In Geography, the children will be learning about where their food comes from and the environmental impacts it can have. How to source locally grown food and the benefits of local food.
