PRIMARY PHASE UPDATE—For a number of years now, pupils have come to school in their PE kits on PE days. We have changed this for September. Pupils will need to bring their PE bag to school at the start of the half term so that it is in school all the time. Pupils will change in their classroom or cloakroom area dependant on their age. At the end of each half term, pupils will bring their PE kits

home for a wash and return them to start the next half term. If older pupils would like to take their kits home weekly for them to be washed, that is fine, but they will need to be returned the following week please.

Our younger pupils have been asked to practise changing over the summer holidays. This will ensure, pupils have their PE kits in school and can take part, meaning that we won't need to phone home to ask you to bring them in.
